Programme of Field Meetings 2005

Welcome to another extremely full and varied programme for 2005. We had a very successful survey of **Rock Sea-lavender**, *Limonium binervosum* last summer and will continue the project with a visit to Snettisham in August. Two other plants are featured this year: the nationally rare **Grey Hair-grass**, *Corynephorus canescens* and **Hoary Mullein**, *Verbascum pulverulentum*. The latter will probably take us a few years as there are numerous sites in *A Flora of Norfolk* – we will just make a start this summer – and perhaps some of you will be kind enough to volunteer to check your local colonies.

There are three identification workshops lined up: **Sedges** with Arthur Copping (who needs no introduction), **Pondweeds** with Chris Preston (the national authority on *Potamogeton*) and **Polypody** with Rob Cooke (BSBI referee for the genus *Polypodium*).

There are two BSBI meetings in the county this year: Arthur Copping is leading a grass and sedge identification weekend on 11th and 12th June and Alec Bull is holding a bramble meeting from 15th to 17th July. Full details are in the BSBI Year Book and if you would like to join in, please contact the leaders directly.

Alec is continuing to organise meetings in Suffolk to help with the proposed flora there and these are included in the list of meetings.
